I want to take this opportunity to thank you for presentation July 23 of the ever popular "A Taste of NAB" in Nashville.

For some reason (probably due to the Email Grinch) many people (myself included) apparently weren't notified until the morning of the event.

However, your presentation was up to its usual high standard despite the 100 degree heat wave outside.

I have been in broadcasting since I started at WRVU AM (600 KHz.), the carrier current campus radio station at Vanderbilt University. WRVU AM is now off the air and WRVU FM is now licensed as an over the air broadcast station. Times do change!

I went into TV in 1968 when I needed summer work to help pay my tuition, landing a part time job at our local CBS affiliate, WLAC-TC (now WTVF). I accepted a full time position there in 1970 when I graduated with my EE degree and stayed until 1975 when I went to Opryland Productions (a division of the then NBC affiliate WSM-TV). Opryland Productions evolved into The Nashville Network (TNN) and launched in 1983 with 7 million subscribers. Viacom acquired CBS in 2000 and rebranded TNN as SPIKE in

2001 when it moved all the operations to New York and gave me and approximately 450 others in Nashville the opportunity to start new careers.

I was 53 at the time, and decided to start my own systems integration company, Media/Broadcast Integration and Technical Services (M/BITS) which opened its doors on October 23, 2001. I took some key people from TNN and a couple of other companies in the area and formed M/BITS, vowing never to be a "walk away integrator" like so many of our competitors who quickly forget their customers when a project is finished. We continue our support of our clients after the project is complete with ongoing technical support, training, and maintenance services.

I have never had a chance to sit down and talk with you at length, but have heard a great deal about your career at both the OITP and "A Taste of NAB" meetings that I have attended, so I decided to reciprocate in this email to you about me and M/BITS.

I have attached a Line Card of the manufacturers that we resell and represent, so you can see that we are also staunch supporters of many of the companies that you work with on your tour.

I also want to thank you for the lunch that you provided yesterday.

I hope that you will continue your tours and presentations for those engineering and technical people who don't get the chance to go to the annual NAB convention each year. It offers many technical people the chance to see stuff that they wouldn't otherwise get to see, as well as hearing an excellent presentation from a veteran broadcaster.
