
From your Sagacious Pixel Larry Bloomfield



Good Advice

We pass along jokes; we pass along just about everything. Do think about passing this information along. It could really help someone. An attorney friend of mine sent this out to his friends and the employees in his company. I pass it along, for your information.

We've all heard horror stories about fraud that's committed in your name, address, SS#, credit, etc. To avert this, place the contents of your wallet on a photocopy machine, do both sides of each license, credit card, etc., you will know what you had in your wallet and all of the account numbers and phone numbers to call and cancel. Keep the photocopy in a safe place. I have a scanner and will be more than willing to do this for you.

This advice came from an attorney friend who, unfortunately has firsthand knowledge; his wallet was stolen awhile back and within a week the thieve(s) ordered an expensive monthly cell phone package, applied for a VISA credit card, had a credit line approved to buy a Gateway computer, received a PIN number from DMV to change his driving record information online, and more.

But here's some critical information he passed on that will limit the damage in case this happens to you or someone you know. As everyone always advises, cancel your credit cards immediately, but the key is having the toll free numbers and your card numbers handy so you know whom to call. Keep those where you can find them easily. File a police report immediately in the jurisdiction where it was stolen, this proves to credit providers you were "diligent," and it's a first step toward an investigation (if there ever is one).

But perhaps the most important thing he shared: - Call the three national credit reporting organizations <u>immediately</u> to place a fraud alert on your name and SS#.

He said: "I had never heard of doing that until advised by a bank that called to tell me an application for credit was made over the Internet in my name."

The alert means any company that checks your credit knows your information was stolen and they have to contact you by phone to authorize new credit. By the time he was advised to do this, almost 2 weeks after the theft, all the damage had been done. There are records of all the credit checks initiated by the thieves' purchases, none of which he knew about before placing the alert. Since then, no additional damage has been done, and the thieves threw his wallet away this weekend (someone turned it in). It seems to have stopped them in their tracks."






The Engineer


God then gave lean beef so that Man might consume fewer calories and still satisfy his appetite. And





Red Square reflection




The Kremlin's Spassky Tower and passers-by are reflected in the wet cobblestones of Moscow's Red Square on Feb. 13th.
